Hildy was an AKC judge and active member of the Collie Club of Colorado, Buckhorn Valley Kennel Club since 1985, and a past member of the Collie Club of America. She contributed her time, energy, and hard-earned expertise. She was also a devoted wife, mother, and grandmother, weaving together family holidays, dog events, and cross-country road trips into a rich, if sometimes gloriously chaotic, family life.

She bred and showed Collies in AKC conformation, obedience, herding, and tracking events. Hildy became a respected AKC judge of conformation, juniors, farm dog, and fetch. Dogs were the thread that ran through most of Hildy's life, but for her they were never "just" dogs. She paid close attention to how dogs and people responded to one another and treated those relationships as a window into loyalty, resilience, and the best parts of being human. A naturally social and curious person, she built circles of friendship wherever she went, drawing people together around training classes, dog shows, and long, thoughtful conversations that often started with dogs and ended with life. We will miss her.

Classes will be divided for Rough and Smooth dogs and bitches. A neutered male may enter the Veteran Dog Class & a spayed bitch may enter the Veteran Bitch Class. 1st place winners compete for Best of Breed.

BEST OF VARIETY/BREED COMPETITION

Best of Variety/Best of Breed Competition - The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Variety or Best of Breed Competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record; dogs which according to their owner's records have completed the requirements for a championship but whose championships are unconfirmed. The showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the day of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owner's records.

BRED-BY EXHIBITOR REQUIREMENTS

All dogs entered in the Bred-By Class must be individually registered with the AKC, the person handling the dog must be a breeder of record and an owner or co-owner of the dog.

BEST BRED-BY-EXHIBITOR (SATURDAY AM ONLY): For first place winners in the Bred-By Exhibitor classes (Adult & Puppy) from both Rough and Smooth. The person handling the dog in the class **MUST** be a breeder of record and an owner or co-owner of record and the dog must be individually registered at the time entries are made with the AKC. For complete rules refer to Chapter 3, Section 8 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows.

BEST PUPPY (SUNDAY AM ONLY): For first place winners in the Puppy 6-9 & 9-12 month Classes from both Rough and Smooth.

Effective immediately, AKC's new Unattended Dogs in Vehicles Policy prohibits leaving dogs unattended in vehicles that are fully enclosed or do not have adequate ventilation and airflow. Simply having fans, air conditioning, temperature monitors, remote alerts, or other electronic devices does not, by themselves, make a vehicle safe for an unattended dog. Owners and handlers are responsible for ensuring dogs are kept in conditions that protect them from heat-related illness, distress, injury, or death.

Violating this policy is considered conduct prejudicial to the best interests of purebred dogs, the sport of purebred dogs, and the American Kennel Club and may result in disciplinary action under the AKC Charter and Bylaws.

SWEEPSTAKES COMPETITION – SATURDAY PM SHOW

Eligibility: This Sweepstakes is open to all Collies, who, on the day of the show, will be at least six months and under eighteen months of age. Professional handlers may handle only their own dogs. Classes to be divided by sex and age. Sweepstake Classes will be judged prior to the regular breed classes. **All Collies in Sweepstakes must also be entered in a regular class at the SATURDAY PM show; any dog entered in a regular class who is eligible will automatically be entered.** Professional handlers may only exhibit dogs that they own. Champions of record are eligible to compete. If entered in a class other than those, please Indicate "Sweepstake & Age Division" in the Additional Classes space. Classes to be divided by sex and include both varieties.

VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES COMPETITION – PM SHOW

Eligibility: This Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Collies, who, on the day of the show, will be at least 7 yrs of age. Neutered males and spayed bitches are eligible for Veteran Sweepstakes. **All Collies in Veteran Sweepstakes must also be entered in a regular/non-regular class at the PM show; any dog entered in a non-regular Veterans class who is eligible will automatically be entered.** Professional handlers may only exhibit dogs that they own. Champions of record are eligible to compete. Judging will be held prior to regular classes. Indicate "Sweepstake & Age Division" in the Additional Classes space.

VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES CLASSES

The class winners will compete for Best in Sweepstakes & Runner up to Best.

Best Veteran in Sweepstakes will be awarded \$50.00 (Minimum entry of four required to be awarded the \$50.00).

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP – ALL SHOWS

NOVICE CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show.

OPEN CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show. Juniors which according to their records have completed the requirements to compete in the Open class but whose status is unconfirmed by the American Kennel Club are limited to competing in the Open Class for a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the Junior completed the requirements according to their records.

MASTER CLASS: This class will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

NOVICE AND OPEN CLASS DIVIDED:

- **Junior-9** years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show
- **Intermediate-12** years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show
- **Senior-15** years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show.

BEST JUNIOR HANDLER: Winners from each class will compete for Best Junior Handler.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department, (919) 233-9767. BE SURE ALL INFORMATION for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on front and back of entry form.

Bitches in season are not eligible to be shown in Junior Showmanship Classes. At a Specialty show, each dog must be of the breed for which the show is held. A dog that has been rejected - dismissed or excused by the veterinarian for the protection of the other dogs at the show or for the protection of the dog excused, may not be handled in Junior Showmanship.

NOTE: SUBSTITUTION OF DOG IN JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP AT THE SHOW(S): There will be an Administration Fee of \$5.00 charged for any substitution of dog in Junior Showmanship at each show. Each dog handled in a regular Junior Showmanship Class must be entered and shown in one of the breed classes at the show or must be entered for Junior Showmanship only. However, a dog that must be withdrawn for good and sufficient reason, such as a bitch in season or a veterinarian's excuse may be replaced by another dog meeting the same requirements. Such substitution must be requested in writing stating the reason for the substitution and must be accompanied by an official AKC entry form.

SHOW SITE & EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

- The Show Site will be available to exhibitors Saturday at 7 am to 7 pm, Sunday 7 am to 6 pm. Dogs may not be left in the building overnight.
- No ex-pens allowed in building.
- Depending on the entry you may be asked to stack crates.
- The show grounds constitute the building & the outside grounds and parking lot.
- All regulations governing the use of this facility, and all regulations and decisions of the Show Committee of this show giving club on this day will be strictly enforced, including and not recorded in this Premium List.
- Grooming will be allowed in the building. Blow dryers in the building will be determined first day of the shows. There is NO dog wash available during these shows.
- No generators to be operated within 100 feet of any ring during judging times.
- Exhibitors and handlers will be held responsible for clean conditions in and around their crates and set up area.
- Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their own dogs, dogs they are exhibiting, or which are under their care or control AT ALL TIMES. This requirement includes both while in the ring or at any location on our show site. Clean up tools and supplies will be available at each ring and at other convenient locations throughout the show grounds. Ring Stewards will be glad to hold your dog while you clean up.
- Dumping of dog food or grooming residue into the restroom sinks and toilets is strictly prohibited!
- NO dogs will be allowed in the restrooms. **NO un-entered dogs allowed on the show grounds.**
- No baby strollers are allowed in the show buildings. Parents are solely responsible for their children and are expected to keep them supervised and controlled at all times for their own safety.
- No double handling will be permitted at these shows. Individuals who attempt to double handle from outside the ring will be subject to action by the Show Committee.
- There shall be no drilling or intensive /abusive training of dogs on the show grounds.
- Dogs must be in control at all times. This includes the use of Flexi leashes.
- No crating or grooming allowed in any aisles or within 10' of show rings. Please keep aisles clear.
- No glass containers are allowed in grooming area.

The Club, DogZibit, their agents, employees, etc., will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will **assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury** sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property participating in these shows, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children at these shows. Failure to do so could result in a Show Committee review being held.

Waiver of Rights: Do not leave dogs in closed vehicles. The club reserves the right to remove any animal in distress from a parked vehicle or crate and all persons attending these dog shows hereby waive any claim for any damages that result from such actions.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND SHOW RULES

1. Entries must reach the Show Secretary, DogZibit, P. O. Box 1176, Duvall, WA 98019 by the closing date & time specified in the Premium List. After which time no entries can be accepted, canceled, changed, substituted, corrected, completed or signed and no entry fees refunded. Any change or cancellation must be made in writing and received prior to closing, except as provided in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the American Kennel Club Dog Show Rules and Regulations. Fees must accompany entries; DogZibit assumes no responsibility for cash sent through the mail. The Club and/or DogZibit assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or agent of the owner.
2. No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, FAX and unsigned entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and photocopies of entry forms without Agreement and Rules on reverse side are **not acceptable**. Exhibitors are admonished to make themselves familiar with this agreement. Rule books may be obtained from the AKC, 5580 Centerview Dr., Raleigh, NC 27606. The Club and/or DogZibit assumes no responsibility for incorrect or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the owner's agent which includes entering a dog in a class which the dog is not eligible to compete. **Responsibility for completeness of entry rests solely with entrant.**
3. **Returned checks** do not constitute a valid entry fee. DogZibit will add a \$30.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. We will not re-process checks. The exhibitor will be contacted & required to send a money order for the original amount PLUS the \$30.00 NSF fee. Subsequent returned checks from same person may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY BASIS.
4. **Exhibitors' entry acknowledgements** will be made as soon as practicable by email to the address given on the entry blank. If not received by the end of the dosing date, notify DogZibit. Judging programs will be sent at least a week prior to the show.
5. **No refunds of entry fees** when a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by the Judge or Veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. There is no refund for duplicate entries or overpayments. If because of riots, wars, strikes, civil disturbances, national emergencies, health emergencies, and the dictates of law enforcement or of the owner(s) of the grounds and/or facilities or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open or to complete the event, no refund of entry fee will be made. Extreme weather conditions, such as, but not limited to snow storms, hurricanes, lightning, extreme heat, heavy rains, or other circumstances including, but not limited to, the condition of the facilities or grounds and/or the ingress and egress from the grounds, must be considered for the health and safety of the dogs, exhibitors and spectators. The well-being of dogs, exhibitors and spectators is of paramount importance and, in the event, it is necessary to cancel or stop the event before completion, no refund of entry fee will be made. To find out about any AKC event cancellations call the AKC Event Cancellation Hotline (877) 252-3229.
6. **Refunds** for cancellations due to judge change or cancellations made prior to entries closing will be mailed by the Club to said Exhibitor or Agent AFTER THE SHOW. An administrative fee of \$5.00 will be withheld from all refunds for entries cancelled prior to the dosing of entries.
7. The Club may **decline any entries** for cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness or other causes, & no one shall have any claim or recourse against the Kennel Club or any official thereof.
8. An AKC Recording Fee and an AKC Event Service Fee of \$4.50 total per entry will be required for each dog entered at any Licensed or Member Club Show, Obedience/Rally Trial or Tracking Test. All Recording and Event Service Fees are paid to the American Kennel Club.
9. Dogs, which according to their owners' records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed Competition, provided this transfer is made to the DogZibit at least one half hour prior to the start of the earliest Conformation judging at the Show.
10. Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs must be ready for judging. Neither the Club nor DogZibit will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or their agents when the dog's presence is needed in a judging ring. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings.
11. **Only dogs eligible for these shows will be admitted into the show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs. All dogs present must be held on leash or confined to their crates except when being judged or when in exercising ring.**
12. **The Club reserves the right to substitute a prize of equal or greater value.**
13. The Club, DogZibit, their agents, employees, etc., will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will **assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury** sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property participating in these shows, and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children at these shows. **Please do not leave any dogs in closed vehicles.** All persons attending this dog show hereby waive any claim for damages against the Club, its members or agents, in the event a motor vehicle must be entered to rescue a dog from overheating or suffocation due to improper ventilation.
14. **All rights to televise, videotape, advertise, photograph, promote** or otherwise exploit this event are vested in the Club, or in persons to whom assignments of such rights have been made in writing by the Club. All persons and animals on the show grounds at any time while the show is in progress, do by attending this show or participating therein, grant to the Club the right to photograph, televise, videotape, audiotape or otherwise use their likeness and voice in any manner without further release or consent. The Club is not responsible for the actions or products of the commercial vendors at the show.
15. Please note: Any hotel or motel listed in the premium list is subject to Event Committee Rules. We expect our exhibitors to be responsible guests. A report that an exhibitor at this show has abused hotel or motel property during this weekend may result in disciplinary action. Clubs reserve the right to decline future entries from the offending party in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows.

- The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record and dogs which, according to their owners' records, have completed the requirements for a championship, but whose championships are unconfirmed. The showing of unconfirmed Champions in Best of Breed competition is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the dog completed the requirements for a championship.
- (Event Class) Consult the classification in this premium list. If the event class in which you are entering your dog is divided, then, in addition to designating the class, specify the particular division of the class in which you are entering your dog, i.e. age division, color division, weight division.
- A dog must be entered in the name of the person who actually owned it at the time entries for an event closed. If a registered dog has been acquired by a new owner it must be entered in the name of its new owner in any event for which entries closed after the date of acquisition, regardless of whether the new owner has received the registration certificate indicating that the dog is recorded in his/her name. State on entry form whether transfer application has been mailed to the AKC. (For complete rules, refer to Chapter 11, Section 3.)
- Mixed Breed dogs entering classes for Agility, Obedience, and Rally trials should mark Breed as "All-American Dog/Mixed Breed." Sire and Dam information shall remain blank for mixed breed entrants.

Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years. Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.



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
